

Kevin is also President of Fox Harb'r Resort in Fox Harbour, Nova Scotia. Kevin is a veteran hospitality & resort development executive who took the reins of Fox Harb'r in 2015. Previously, he was President & COO at Skyline Hotels & Resorts in Ontario from 2009 to 2015. From 2005 – 2009 Kevin was Managing Partner & Owner of Rockwater Secret Cove Resort in British Columbia. From 1987 to 2005, Kevin was with Fairmont Hotels & Resorts (CP) as Manager / General Manager starting his Fairmont career at Chateau Halifax then moving onto Hotel Macdonald, Chateau Laurier, Jasper Park Lodge and Chateau Whistler. He has been active in the tourism industry for many years. He was the Chair of the Edmonton Hotel Association and sat on the Board of Directors for the Alberta Hotel Association as well as Tourism Whistler. He held the Chairman's position with the Sunshine Coast Tourism Association as well as Jasper Hotel & Tourism Association. She is a Founding member of Women in Film and Television Atlantic and Founding member of Atlantic Canada's newest multicultural festival, Nova-MultiFest. Member of Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre, Canadian Actors Equity, Actra and the Directors Guild of Canada. Board member of The Robert Pope Foundation and Matchstick Theatre. Named the 2023 Portia White Prize Winner by Creative Arts NS and the 2022 Woman of the Year by the union representing 28,000 professional actors across the country, ACTRA. Juanita Peters is also a recipient of the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee medal and the King Charles III Coronation Medal.

David Hovell, Owner/Operator, Magic Winery Bus Limited (INCOMING)

An Acadia University Bachelor of Business Administration graduate, David's pursuits in entrepreneurship were inspired by a project to become a John Deere dealer. In 1995, his dream was achieved, and he became a founding partner in Planters Equipment Limited, a John Deere agriculture and consumer equipment dealership serving the Annapolis Valley; now Green Diamond Equipment, the single store has grown to fifteen locations throughout the Maritimes.
